

This form searches the [Social Security Administration baby names database](#) and compares name popularity in different areas of the country.

A name appears in the database if there were 5 or more births with that name in a given year.

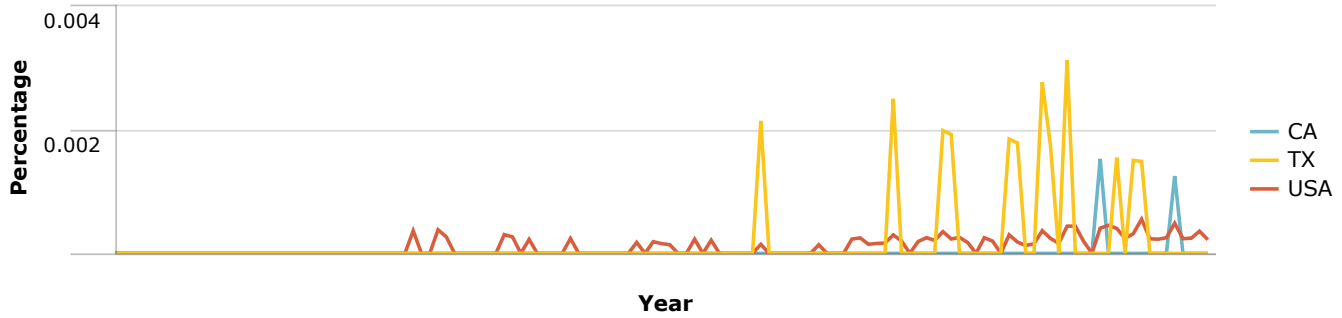
The data is grouped by area (state or nation-wide), then by sex, and the 5 births rule applies to the most granular grouping.

E.g. if there were 3 male and 3 female babies named "Tracy" in 1930 in Tennessee, there would be no data point.

Select the "Mah Bukkit!" option if you get a "too many datapoints" error - or choose a shorter time range.

### Name Percentage by Area

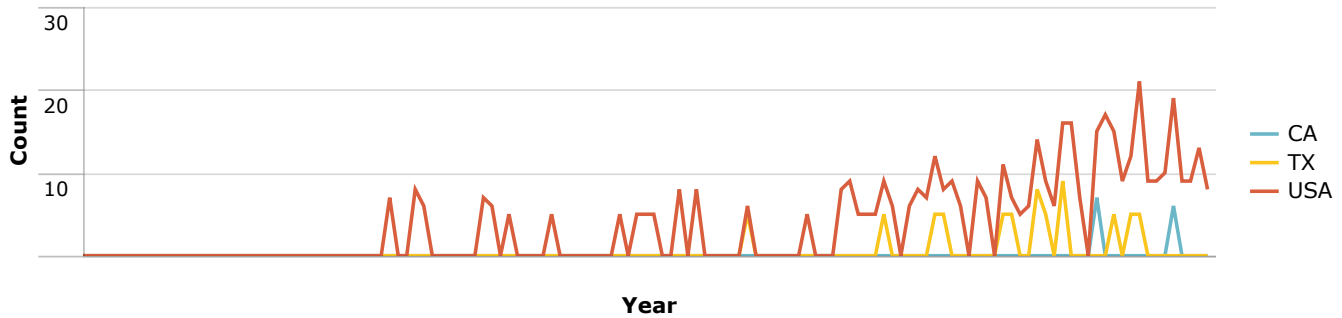
